Parental support is essential to their child's success. Please review the code of discipline and the school expectations with your child. It is also important to collaborate with your child's teacher if needed to ensure that your child is following school rules.

Electronics & Games:

Students are not permitted to possess gaming devices, toys or anything else that is disruptive to the learning environment without authorization from a teacher. Any unauthorized item will be confiscated and returned only to a parent or guardian.

Required Documents

All required documents must be submitted to your child's classroom teacher and/or school secretary. Please keep originals and copies at home as well.

Emergency Blue Card

An updated emergency blue card is required for each student every year. Please complete emergency blue cards to provide the school with the required information. Documentation for all restrictions (medical/safety/legal) must be submitted to your child's teacher or the main office. In addition, make your child's teacher aware of any restrictions at the beginning of the school year using the Beginning of year packet.

Parents/guardians must update contact information as soon as it changes by submitting an updated blue card. In addition, all individual include daycare provider who will pick up your child must be listed on the blue card.

Health Requirements/Immunizations

All students entering a NYC School or child care facility for the first time must have a complete physical examination and all required immunizations.

Medication

School staff is prohibited from providing or administering any medication, including aspirin, to any student. However, if medication must be given at school, a completed 504 form must be submitted to the nurse.

If medical accommodations are needed, a completed 504 form must also be provided to the nurse. After a medical procedure, a medical clearance from the doctor must be submitted to the nurse when your child returns to school.

School Bus

Parents/guardians are required to submit an application for school bus services. If your child qualifies, parents/guardians will be notified in writing. A note must be sent to inform your child's teacher when to start putting him/her on the bus.

Students will not be sent home on the bus on the first day of school unless parents send them to school with a written request which includes the bus route information.

SCHOOL BUS

Once a child is assigned to go home by bus, parents/guardians have to ensure that he/she is picked up at the drop off location.

Pre-Kindergarten students enter through Main Entrance on Belknap Street

K-2 students will enter through Exit 3 on 136th Avenue (Near Auditorium)

Grades 3-5 will enter through Exit 2 on Belknap Street (Closest to 137th Avenue)

**Late students who arrive after 8:35 AM must use the main entrance and take a late pass to class.

Dismissal: 2:50PM

Students must be picked up from their assigned dismissal area at 2:50PM.

Pre-Kindergarten-classroom dismissal parents will enter Main entrance on

Belknap Street between 2:40-2:50pm

K-2 students will be dismissed at Exit 3 (Near Auditorium)

Grades 3-5 will be dismissed Exit 2 on Belknap Street (Near 137th Ave)

Please make arrangements to safely pick up your child by 2:50PM from his or her teacher. Students not picked up on time must be signed out by an individual listed on their emergency blue card.

Absences, Lateness and Early Pick Up

Schools are required to keep accurate records of students' attendance. Please send a note to your child's teacher to inform the school of his/her absence, lateness or if your child will be picked up early.

In order to ensure a safe dismissal for all, early pick up can only be accommodated before 2:30PM. After 2:30PM, making arrangements for early pick up can cause delays for entire classes and lead to safety concerns.

Student Performance and Evaluation

Our most important goal is to ensure that your child is learning every day. Teachers are assessing your child's progress daily and will keep you updated on his/her progress as well as his/her academic and social emotional goals. Report cards will be sent home at the end of the 3 marking periods (November 2021, March 2022, June 2022). In addition, 3 progress reports (Oct. 2021, Jan. 2022, May 2022) will be sent home to provide information on how students are doing before report cards go home. Below is the current grading policy that will be used to determine grades for all subjects.

Teacher will assess all students in reading using a reading assessment (TCRWP) at least 3 times per year to help measure their progress. It is important that students know their reading levels (From A to Z) to ensure that they are reading the right books independently. Students are expected to move up 3 to 4 reading levels per school year.

In addition, teacher grade teams will assess students using performance tasks as common assessments in reading and math every other month. Our school will also use the Imagine Learning Program to monitor student progress.

It is recommended that parents review the assessment portfolios of their children regularly to support at home.



Health and Safety Information for Parents

Your child's safety is our first priority. We are working to keep all students safe. Our protocols to keep school communities safe and healthy are as follows:

- Prevention: Starting with the first day of the 2021-22 school year, if a student or staff member is feeling sick, they are required to stay home. Additionally, if their symptoms are consistent with COVID-19, they will be asked to get tested.
- Feeling Sick in School: If a student begins experiencing symptoms in school, they will be isolated and monitored by a school staff member until they are picked up by their parent or guardian. Please <u>do not</u> send your child to school if he/she is exhibiting any of the following symptoms:
 - * A temperature of 100 or above (children need to be free of a temperature for 24 hours before returning to school)
 - *Vomiting/Diarrhea * Sore throat * Earache * Persistent Coughing * Severe Cold * Unexplained rash

A doctor's note is needed before returning to school after any absence of 3 days or more.

- Testing: All school staff members are asked to get tested for COVID-19 in the days leading up to the beginning of school, and will be prioritized for expedited results at the 34 City-run testing sites. All school staff are also asked to get tested monthly during the school year. This free testing is also available for families citywide.
- Tracing: In the event of a confirmed COVID-19 case in a school, NYC Test + Trace and NYC Health will investigate to determine close contacts within the school. All students and teachers in the classroom with the confirmed case are assumed close contacts and will be instructed to self-quarantine for 14 days since their last exposure to that case. In older grades where students may travel between classes, this applies to all classes that the confirmed case was in.

NURSE

Our school nurse, <u>Ms. Alexander</u> is on duty from 8a.m. to 3p.m. and will evaluate your child in case of illnesses while at school. In case of an illness, the school nurse will contact you via phone or letter. All students are required to have an annual physical on file. In addition, students

with asthma and other medical conditions may require extra forms in order for related medicated to be kept on premises and administered in the case of an emergency.

<u>Please Note</u>: Our teachers are not authorized to administer medication to the children. Children are not allowed to self-medicate, without the proper documentation from a medical professional.

Additional Parent Information

Parent Support

Our staff aims to collaborate with parents/guardians to ensure the success of all of our students. Your child's teacher is your primary contact if you have any questions or concerns.

Our Parent Coordinator, Ms. Perez will be available daily and can be contacted via email (lperez32@schools.nyc.gov) or by text and talk 862-367-6689.

It is important to discuss your child's progress with your child's teacher at least each marking period. Teachers will keep you informed by sending home progress reports and report cards. Teachers will provide small group instruction to students who need academic support as needed to ensure that their students are progressing toward grade standards.

If needed, your child's teachers will make referrals for additional academic intervention and monitor your child's progress. Parents/guardians must give the school written permission to give provide academic or guidance intervention for about 6 weeks in addition to the classroom support provided by the classroom teacher. After the additional support, the classroom teacher will inform parents of next steps based on his/her assessment.

Parent Association (P.A.)

Parents/Guardians are encouraged to support the Parent Association. Meetings are held monthly during, which students of the month are celebrated. The P.A. email is 29q037pa@schools.nyc.gov. Our PA President, Ms. Sarah Howard.

Safety

All schools are required to conduct multiple safety drills and to implement the DOE safety protocols from the Code of Discipline and the Safe Transitions handbook during the school year. There are 3 types of drills that are required:

School Attire

Students are strongly encouraged to wear their school uniform which consists of white tops and navy bottoms. Classes with 100% uniforms will be recognized monthly with special prizes and incentives. We will incorporate dress down days to recognize special events, such as school spirit, character day, friendship day, etc.

LOST AND FOUND


